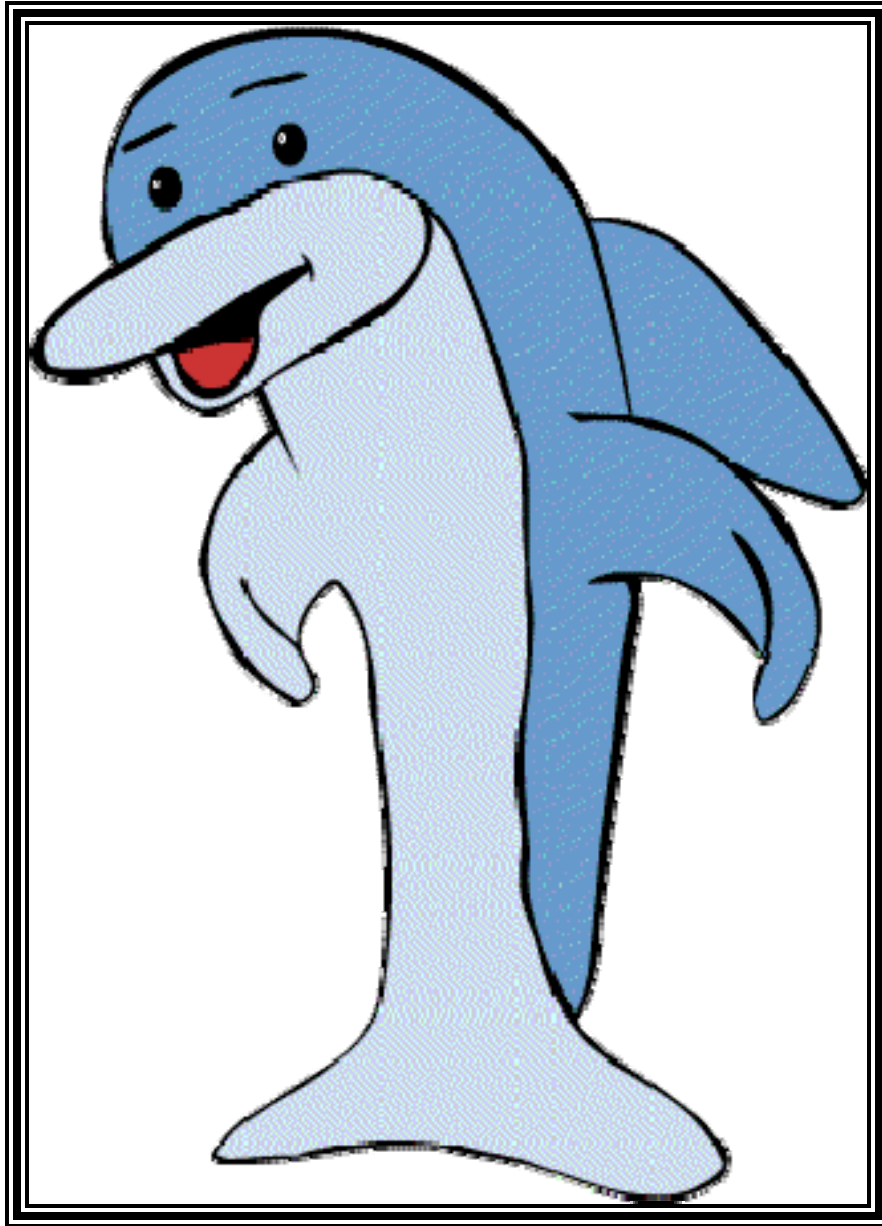

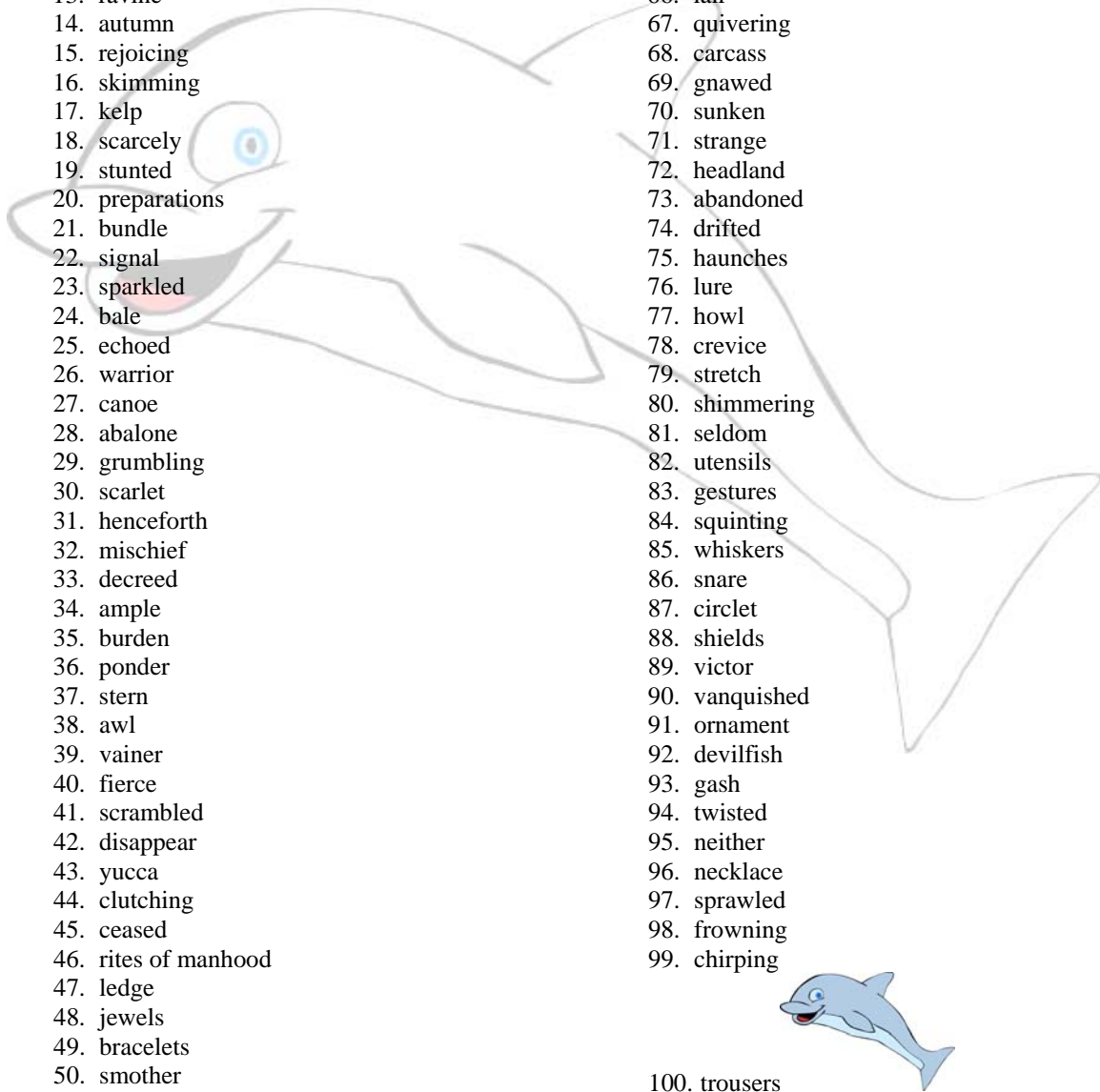

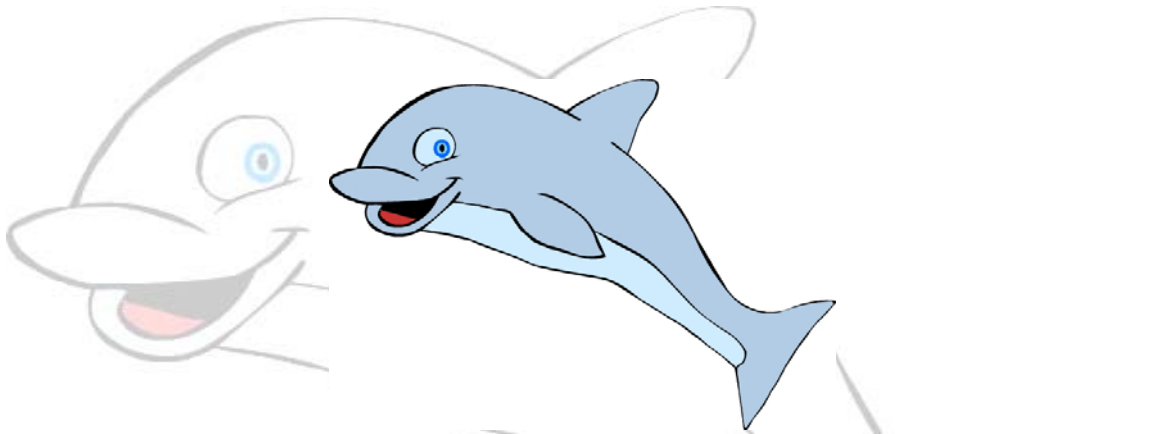
## Island of the Blue Dolphins

**Monthly Book Report**

All children will choose and read a book about a famous American. It can be any American, but the biography should be at least 50 pages.

Then children will report on the book in one of the first nine ways to do a book report (posted on class website). This will count as your book for the next month. After they have reported in one of the first nine ways we will do a PowerPoint presentation on the famous American.



1. You may use the book report form. Be sure to include a short summary.
2. Give an oral presentation of a main character.
3. Rewrite the ending of the story
4. Do an advertisement for the book, make a poster, or diorama.
5. As a reporter, write an interview with one of the main characters.
6. Write a newspaper article about one of your favorite events in the story.
7. Write a letter to the editor persuading him to change a portion of the book.
8. Write a letter to the author telling him why you appreciate the book.
9. Write a letter to your class convincing them to read this special book.
10. Do a PowerPoint presentation of your book.

The tenth way is the way everyone in class will do. In class we will be teaching PowerPoint, but also will show students how to use the presentation program in Google Docs.

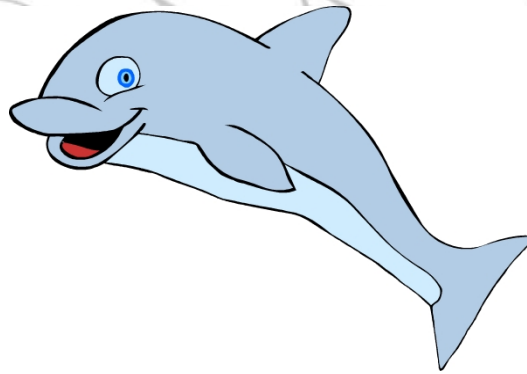

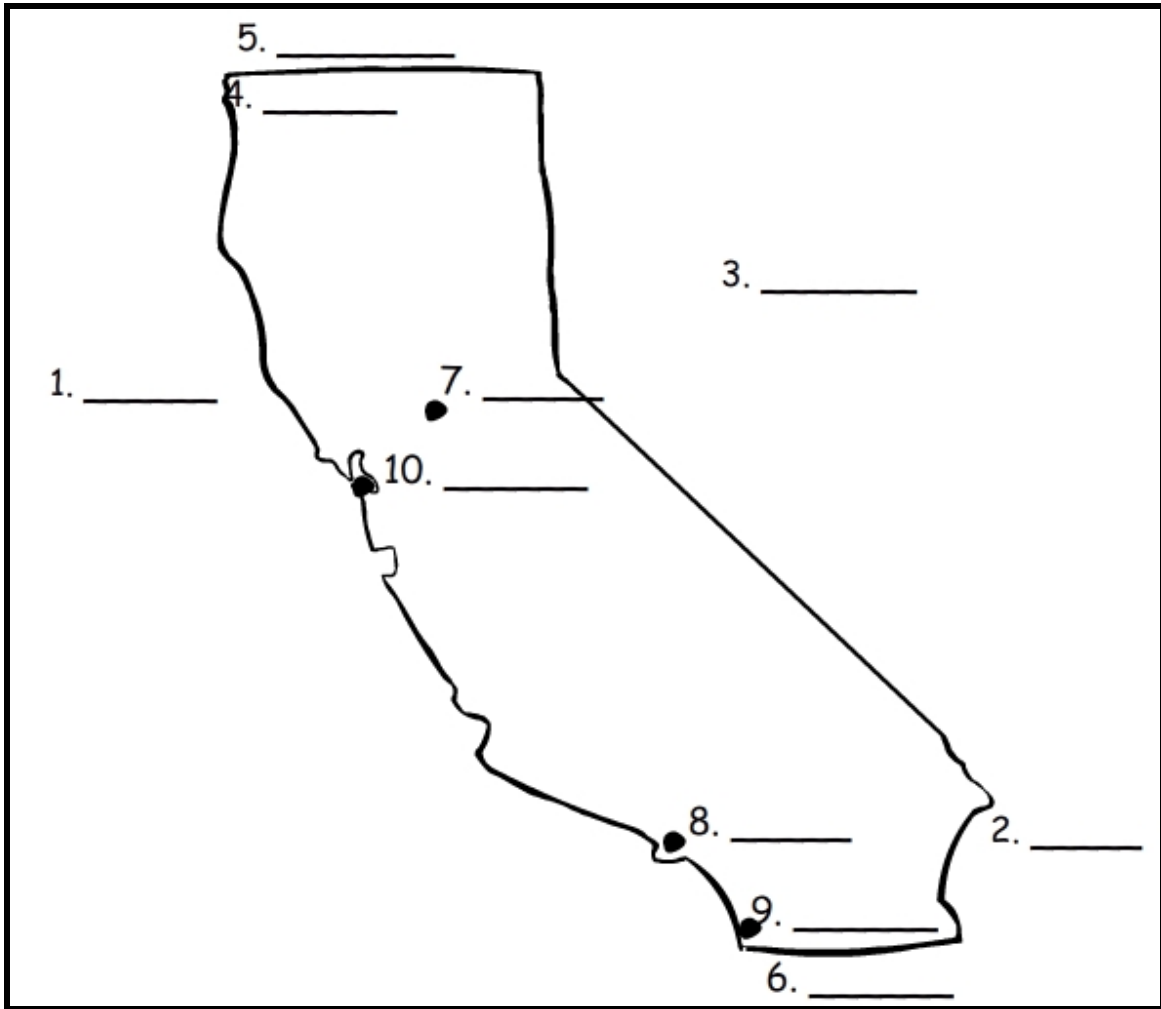

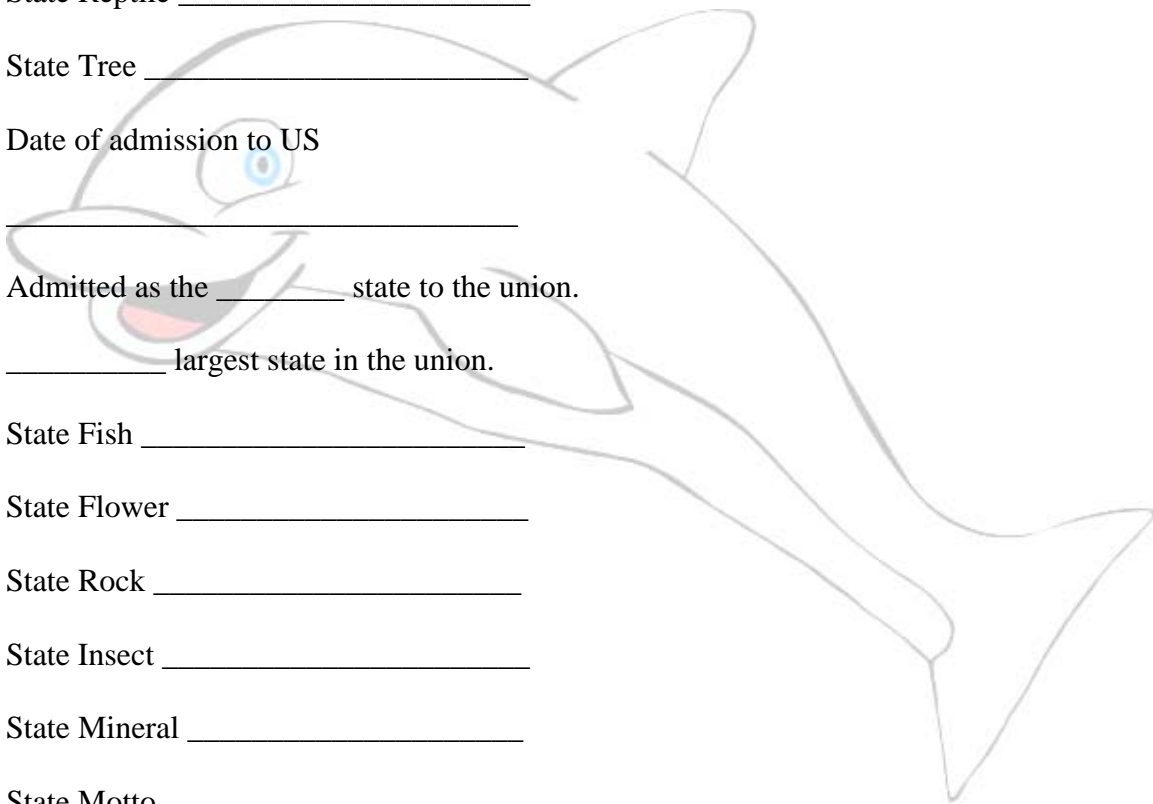
